






- In computed tomography, the number of procedures and the collective dose have risen markedly. The number of procedures has increased by about 80% and the collective dose has increased by around 70%.
- While there is evidence of some reduction in the average dose per procedure, use of computed tomography continues to grow

Importance/ legal aspects of justification of imaging procedures



- The BSSD requires individual radiological procedures to be justified in advance, taking into account the specific objectives of the procedure and the patient's characteristics, and prescribes a justification process under the clinical responsibility of a radiological practitioner and involving the referring physician.
- The Directive requests Member States to introduce <u>referral guidelines</u> for medical imaging, which should be made available to the referrers.
- EU-JUST-CT project is embedded in the broader Strategic Agenda for Medical Ionising Radiation Applications (SAMIRA) of the European Commission



ESR guidelines



- 2,300 indications with associated exams incl. appropriateness ratings for defined patient groups
 - Age range: 0-150 years
 - Sex: male, female, either
- Appropriateness ratings
 - 1-3 (red): usually not appropriate
 - 4-6 (yellow): may be appropriate
 - 7-9 (green): usually appropriate

DEVELOPMENT OF EUROPEAN IMAGING REFERRAL GUIDELINES



CT & MRI Audit, Luxembourg (2019)



A HIGH PROPORTION OF CT (39%) AND MRI (21%) REQUESTS ARE INAPPROPRIATE

INAPPROPRIATE REFERRALS: ANOTHER EXAM WOULD HAVE BEEN APPROPRIATE IN 67% (CT) AND 58% (MRI) OF CASES

35% OF CT AND 55% OF MRI REFERRALS LACKED CLINICAL INFORMATION TO ASSESS APPROPRIATENESS

Objectives

The 36-month project aims to improve justification of computed tomography in Europe through coordinated action.

The project will meet the following specific objectives:

- a) Collect up-to-date information about justification of CT examinations in Europe.
- b) Develop a common methodology for auditing justification of CT examinations.
- c) Carry out co-ordinated pilot audits of justification of CT examinations.
- d) Discuss the status of justification of CT examinations with the Member States and identify opportunities for further action.



Continuous involvement of Steering Group and Advisory Group

SG/AG have been consulted on all deliverables submitted to EC so far and their input is documented as part of each deliverable



- The Auditor Pool was established by inviting NCAs from the 7 participating countries to nominate 4 auditors each (plus min. 2 alternatives in case of dropouts) from their countries.
- Auditors were contacted and agreements signed with each of them in March 2022. Where necessary (e.g., for health reasons) alternatives were appointed to ensure each country had at least 4 auditors in place.
- Auditors were provided training in the use of the ESR iGuide and a test audit was carried out on referrals provided by NCAs from HU and EE.
- Auditors began receiving referrals from their NCAs in May 2022 and the audit was finalised in all countries by February 6, 2023.

EU-JUST-CT Methodology




- Random sample of CT requests
- Two auditors per referral, four auditors per country
- Referrals assessed using ESR iGuide web portal
- Structured appropriateness assessment using Excel forms

- Key parameters
 - Completeness & clarity of reason for exam
 - Appropriateness of requested exam
 - Existence of more appropriate alternative exams
